ANOTHER CRACK AT THE FRONT LINES. HIT MIDDLE CLOUDS CROSSING THE CHANNEL & THICK HAZE. DROPPED DOWN TO 11,000' WHICH IS TOO LOW. EXPECTED THEM TO START THROWING ROCKS AT US. HAZE WAS BUMPY & ROUGH MAKING IT VERY HARD TO FLY FORMATION. ALSO A LOT OF PROP WASH DUE TO SO MANY WINGS IN THE AREA.

DROPPED AT 200' INTERVALS
OMETER SETTING. GROUP
LEAD STARTED A TURN BEFORE
ALL BOMBS WERE AWAY, TO
AVOID A LITTLE FLAK. THE

BOTTOM BOMB IN OUR RIGHT
RACK DIDN'T RELEASE, AND
THE REST OF THEM WERE
BOUNCING OFF OF IT.

FORMATION SPLIT UP. WE LEFT
FORMATION OVER CHANNEL TO DROP
REMAINING BOMBS. PROCEEDING
BACK TO BASE ALONE
